GUIDELINES FOR POSTER PRESENTERS

General Information

Thank for your upcoming presentation at IMPI 56. With your help, we are looking forward to a very productive program, in a great venue. Poster presentations are an essential part of IMPI Symposia; being partially integrated with their social activities, they allow the presenters illuminate the essence of their work through direct (and less formal) interaction with the interested parties. Simultaneously, the attendees are given plenty of opportunities for in-depth consideration of posters of their choice.

Poster presentations will occur at two dedicated sessions (Poster/Exhibitor Sessions) as well as at the Welcome Reception and during coffee breaks. In addition to conventional interactions with the attendees, those poster presenters who do not have an oral presentation on the same topic are invited to give a brief 2-minute oral presentation during a **Poster Flash** Session on the morning of June 15th. When talking at that Flash Session, poster presenters could show to the attendees one slide illustrating the essence of their reported work.

Poster Presentations Logistics

Posters should be placed Tuesday June 14th before the 3:00pm start of the Symposium and should remain in place for the duration of the Symposium. Poster presenters should be present at your poster during the designated poster sessions.

Posters will be attached to 91 cm x 122 cm cardboard plaques (supplied by the Symposium along with materials to attach your poster to the cardboard plaque). Posters will then be set on an easel either in the Exhibit Hall itself, or in the adjacent foyer between the Exhibit Hall and the Main Room. This has the following implications:

- (1) The poster will be viewed at a minimum distance of a table. All features on the poster should be sufficiently large to be legible at that distance.
- (2) It will be useful to come equipped with a “collapsible antenna” or another pointer.
